

What you had to say in your Survey results

First of all thanks to everyone who completed their surveys. We gave each adult in a household a survey, so we estimate that the Field Directors gave out about 1200. We had 767 surveys turned into Irene Backes. Irene received surveys from two chapters after the cut off date and were not included in the final figures. We are very pleased with the number of surveys completed.

- We had 525 comments on why they don't come to Spring Fling and Statewide. We will give you the top 10 reasons at the workshop.
- We had 48 suggestions on where we could hold our State campouts. We will give you the top 5.
- We had 47 suggestions on events to add to our State Campouts. We will go over the top 7.
- 21 surveys suggested events we should drop

- from State campouts. Top 3 will be discussed.
- 475 people felt they would consider reimbursing your Field Directors for some of their expenses.
- A whopping 663 people said their Field Directors are giving you enough information.
- 93 surveys had suggestions for additional content in the Embers. We go over the top 10.
- 271 people said they would consider not getting the Embers by mail and read it in the website.
- There were 136 suggestions on ways we might improve Colorado FCRV. We will review the top 10.

Loana and Bill will share their thoughts at the workshop. At the April Field Staff meeting we will go over the survey in detail and work on implementing many suggestions in 2013.


ride along with the hired hand's dog named Rock.

From there we walked to the Convention Center to get a look at the latest in RVs.




Although


