Poster Contest will be held on Saturday We are looking for lots and lots of people to enter posters this year; go to your chapters and get people to do a poster and enter them. Make sure you get your posters to the right place for judging. If you submit a poster of any kind, you must be sure that you are a member of FCRV in good standing. When the field director puts their stamp on the poster, it is their responsibility to make sure they are members in good standing.

YOUTH/TEEN/ADULTS CONSERVATION POSTER CONTEST

ALL Conservation Posters must be turned in for judging at Spring Fling on Saturday morning to Anita Maile, Colorado's Conservation Director. If the posters get turned in after the judging is completed, they will be disqualified. Please check your schedules for time to turn in posters.

As you can see below, this contest is open to all ages: Youths, Teens, and Adults. The winning poster in each category will be sent to National Campvention in July for competition. The rules are as follows:

A poster will be defined as a medium to

catch the attention of the observer and convey a specific conservation message pertaining to some phase of conservation.

Each poster must be approved by a Field Director and signed by the Field Director to certify that the entrant is a member in good standing with FCRV.

Posters must be on standard sized poster board (approximately 22" X 28", not to vary more than ½"). Do not put scalloped edges around your posters, they will be disqualified.

Name, birth date, chapter, complete address of contestant and Field Director's certification (stamp)

must appear on the lower left hand

corner of the back of the poster. The posters must be the contestants' own work and must have been created for the FCRV contest only.

Any art media may be used. Age categories will be:

Up to 5 years inclusive

6 – 8 years inclusive

9 - 11 years inclusive

12 – 14 years inclusive

15 – 19 years inclusive

20 years and older

Age is determined as of July 1st of the year of the contest

Judging at all levels will be based on adherence to National Conservation Board Rules: Originality, Neatness, and Adherence to or development of the theme.

"CAMPING IS" POSTER CONTEST

The "Camping Is" Poster Contest will be held at Spring Fling on Saturday. This contest is open to all Colorado Youth. All posters must be turned in to the State Youth Director on Saturday morning. There will not be any special time set aside for the youth to do their posters at Spring Fling, so they need to be completed before arrival. The winning poster in each category will be sent to the National Campvention in July for competi-

tion. Colorado awards will be handed out at the Spring Fling Saturday evening program. Contestants who enter should portray what camping means to them.

The contest rules are as follows:

The contest is divided into four age

groups:

5-6 years

7-8 years

9-10 years

11-12 years

Age to be determined as of July 1st of the year of the contest.

Contestants' parents must be members of FCRV in good standing.

Posters must be on standard sized

Posters must be on standard sized poster board (approximately 22" X 28" not to vary more than ½")

Name, birth date and complete address of the contestant along with the Field Director or State Director's certification (stamp) of FCRV membership must appear on the lower left hand corner on the back of the entry.

COLORING CONTEST FOR FCRV YOUTH

The Coloring Contest is planned to give the very youngest FCRV youth (ages 0-4) an opportunity to express themselves creatively. This contest takes the place of the "Camping Is" Poster Contest for these ages. The contest will take place at Spring Fling and the winner will be sent to the National Campvention in July for competition. The contest rules are as follows:

 Contestants' parents must be FCRV members in good standing.

- Official entry forms are required. Entry form will be available from the State Youth Director or the State Director during the contest at Spring Fling
- Coloring must be child's own work and must be in crayon or colored pencil only.
- Each state may enter only one entry per age group at the National Contest to be judges at the National Campvention.
- Age groups are: 0-2 and 3-4.

- Name, birth date and complete address of contestant along with the Field Director or State Director's certification (stamp) of FCRV membership must appear on the lower left hand corner on the back of the entry.
- Age will be determined on July 1st of the contest year.
- Each first place entry becomes the property of FCRV for promotional purposes. All other entries may be claimed at the end of Spring Fling.

If you are planning on having a vendor booth at Spring Fling, please <u>attach this application to your registration</u> form and indicate whether you need electricity or not. We are very limited on space in the building, so please register your booth along with your camping registration so that we can plan ahead of time.

If you are going to need space for your chapter project sales, please let us know that as well by attaching this form to your camping registration. A limited amount of tables will be available for chapter project sales, but if you need more than one, please furnish them yourselves.

STATE HISTORIANS'S SCRAPBOOK CONTEST FOR SPRING FLING

Chapter Historian's, it's time to begin collecting those "priceless" photos and memorabilia from your chapter meetings/campouts/projects and get that chapter scrapbook completed. Guidelines for your scrapbook are as follows:

- Page 1 (the actual first page, not the inside cover) or title page, Chapter Name, Nat'l Charter Number, Charter Date, Chapter Patch or Emblem, Colors and State.
- Lower right hand corner of title page to be reserved for State Director's certification (stamp).
- Scrapbook shall be no larger than 20" X 24" X 8".
- Include a list of officers and a schedule for the

year with dates, name of host and location.

- Explain who and what is pictured in the photo.
- Limit the subject matter to your chapter activities only.
- Include chapter awards.
- Include a photo of chapter patch if possible.
- Scrapbooks shall cover events from January 1st to December 31st.

Please be aware that <u>not</u> complying with all the rules will disqualify your scrapbook.

Don't let this happen to you.

There will be a short meeting on Friday night conducted by JoAnn Lien to go over your scrapbooks to be sure they will be in order for the judging. Any chapter submitting a scrapbook is encouraged to attend this meeting.



The Rocky Explorers are hosting the 3rd Annual North Colorado Medical Center (NCMC) Bloodmobile on Saturday during Spring Fling. The non-profit NCMC Blood Donor Center provides blood to patients at North Colorado Medical Center in Greeley.

Did you know that;

- over 50 blood donors are needed daily to meet the needs of the trauma, surgery, and cancer patients in these hospitals,
- less than 5% of the eligible population donates blood,
- one pint of blood can be separated into 3 components (red blood cells, plasma and platelets) potentially saving 3 lives,
- between 5 and 8 pints of blood are needed for the average open-heart surgery,
- the number one users of blood are cancer patients,
- there is no substitute for human blood. It cannot be manufactured and animal blood cannot replace it,
- the average adult body has 10-12 pints of blood,
- your body constantly makes new blood and will replace the donated volume within 24 hours.

The entire process takes about an hour. The actual donation only takes 7-10 minutes.

All donors must bring a driver's license or photo I.D. with their date of birth.

Donors should drink plenty of fluids the day before and the day of the donation.

There is no upper age limit to donate blood and a great many medical conditions do not prevent you from donating. You must be in good general health and weigh at least 110 lbs.

- 10. You get a custom FCRV Blood Donor patch.
- 9. You get a free mini medical exam & will learn your blood type.
- 8. It will make your family and friends proud.
- 7. It shows you care.
- 6. You'll get free cookies and juice.

- 4. You get to put your feet up and be pampered by bloodmobile staff.
- 3. 90% of us will need blood at some time in our lives.
- 2. You don't have to prepare for it. (Except to eat at least 4 hrs. before donating!)...

National Elections

The only office that has a challenger to vote on is the Office of National President. The current national president is Dave Ludwig who is running again. Mike did speak to everyone at the Chapter Officers workshop in February.

National is moving towards the election this spring, where they will be electing someone for the office of President, Vice President of Programs, and Recording/Corresponding Officer. Ballots will be mailed to all active FCRV members. The ballots will include both instructions on how to vote online as well as instructions on how to complete the paper ballot and return it so that it can be counted. They anticipate that the ballots will be mailed the first part of March with the voting window open until April 15th. The online voting efforts were very successful last election.

Grease casserole dish. Combine all ingredients. Bake at 350° for 45 minutes. Sprinkle top with grated cheese, if you wish.





7 things not to do at a campground

The other obvious stuff

I love to camp with my wife and two little boys, ages 3 and 5. I'd say that 75-80 percent of the campers we've encountered over the years have been good people who understand the need to be considerate while sleeping with fellow travelers in the great outdoors. But it only takes one dud to ruin your camping experience.

A bad camping trip can make the pleasures of home seem awfully enticing. A great one can remind you of how magical camping can be--given the right circumstances and neighbors.

I prefer to camp at state and national parks because the tent sites tend to be cheaper and more spacious than private campgrounds, where you can sometimes feel like you are stacked on top of your fellow campers. But if you don't plan far ahead, getting a coveted site at a state or national park on a summer weekend can be extremely difficult.

No matter where you pop your tent, here are seven things not to do a campground.

1. Check-in late at night. What's it like to be near someone who decides to check in late at night? Last summer, on a rainy night at a state park in Vermont, we heard noises very close to our tent after midnight. We were alarmed because it was a Monday night and the place had totally cleared out after the weekend, with just one family left in our vicinity. Our paranoia grew when a bright, blinding light illuminated our tent. When we had checked in, a park ranger had mentioned that there had been some bear sightings and we feared that the rangers were tracking a bear near our campsite. Eventually, we fell asleep without further incident. The next morning, we found out that the noises we heard were late arriving campers who used their high beams, pointed right into our tent, as they set up their tent in the rain. Some campgrounds police arrival times, but many don't. There is no graceful way to set up camp in the middle of the night, so please, just don't do it.

- 2. Get drunk. For every one person who becomes quiet and introspective when intoxicated, there are a dozen who get loud and obnoxious. If you stay reasonably coherent, you'll be less likely to annoy your neighbors.
- 3. Bring a yappy dog. No one thinks that their dog is annoying, but we all know that some pets are better off left home. The only thing worse than a camper who stands by idly as their dog barks at passersby, squirrels or for no reason at all, is one who leaves their dog or dogs chained up, unattended at their campsite while they go off for the day. If you have a dog that likes to bark, buy them a citronella collar or leave them at home.
- 4. Ignore quiet hours rules. This is the most important and often ignored camping etiquette rule in the book. Nearly every campground has rules prohibiting noise late at night and early in the morning, but most places also don't have the staff to enforce them. At a Kampgrounds of America campground near St. Joseph, Michigan, in July, we wound up next to a trio of women who woke us up at 5 a.m. (4 a.m. in our time zone) with loud chatter, right outside our tent, slamming their car door repeatedly, and allowing their dog to bark incessantly. When I got dressed and walked out in the darkness to confront them, they made no apologies. "We have a race to get to," one said, as though that justified waking others up in the pre-dawn hours on a Sunday morning. 5. Leave behind your bar of used soap, especially if it's hairy You might justify leaving your bar of soap thinking that someone
- one wants to use your leftover soap, so please take it with you.

 6. Bring your boom box. I don't care how good you think your taste in music is -- the truth is that no one wants to hear it except for you. Headphones are a glorious invention, but since too many campers fail to pack them, don't forget your earplugs.

7. The other obvious stuff. One would think that campers would know not to snap the branches off of trees for firewood, drive fast around the campground, litter, and leave a fire unattended, but I've seen people do all of these things. Everyone slips up occasionally but a little common courtesy goes a long way, especially in the great outdoors.

That's it for this time.


