They have always supported the state by attending every Spring Fling and Statewide, plus their interest displayed in all the activities of Colorado FCRV.

The chapter is active in the CAMP program with several members participating.

Also, they can see by their Chapter shirts that they are members of a camping club and folks will come up and talk to them directly to learn what FCRV is all are about.

Twelve members attended the D.A.S.A.T. Seminar at Spring Fling, May 2013 on how to use Portable Fire Extinguishers.

The Star Chasers Chapter is active in performing community work on behalf of FCRV and their Chapter. At their monthly campout in July they were at Fort Collins KOA in Fort Collins, CO, where they collected \$2 a person to play their miniature golf and donated a total of \$70 it to the KOA Cancer Camp.

Just before Halloween in October, all the members of the Chapter bought stuffed animals and activity toys for the sick children at Children's Hospital in Aurora, CO. All together they donated 165 bags to the hospital. The cost per bag is estimated at about \$20 equating to over \$3,000 donated. Each person/couple took at least five bags each. This is a project they have been doing for years now and the hospital has become dependent on them to help brighten the world of the children who are convalescing in the hospital at this festive time of the year.

In November right before Thanksgiving at our November meeting, they collect can goods and other non-perishable food from all the members to donate to the Salvation Army food bank in Centennial, CO. This year they donated 250 lbs of food, which they were told came at a time when their food bank was very low. So they were very appreciative of their donation. Also, we split the 50/50 fund which they collect all year. A check for \$150 was also given to the same Salvation Army so they could purchase food more specific to their particular needs. Another check for \$150 was also donated to the 9 News Colorado Cares Colorado Shares food drive. They represent themselves as part of FCRV when they make the donations to promote the organization.

Throughout the year, they donate food and sundry items to the troops. This year a total of eight boxes were mailed to Afghanistan. They want the troops to remember that they are in their thoughts and prayers and that they do not take for granted the sacrifices they are making for us.

Lastly, they collected a total of 418 pounds of gently used clothes which was donated to the Samaritan House in Denver. They know that the clothes were going to people in need who cannot afford to buy new clothes while they are trying to recover and get back on their feet again.

They would also like to add that the Star Chasers does their best to support Colorado FCRV. They host the Bolo Horseshoes game at Spring Fling in May. There were six rigs at Spring Fling. They also volunteer to work Registration at the State Wide Campout in the Fall. They come in on Thursday night to set up and then work Friday through Saturday. We had 10 rigs at Statewide and everyone participated in working the Registration job. Dan and Judy Kimzey of our Chapter are the State Photographers and they spend many hours taking pictures at State and National events. They also help to support Colorado FCRV First Aid and Teen Queen Programs.

In Summary, as a Chapter they feel very fortunate to be able to support FCRV and their surrounding communities.

All is still quiet as far as we are concerned. No big noise regarding Parks, Fees, etc. Gun Control is another matter.

Thought I would slip this info in regarding Colorado Trails as a change of pace this Summer and Fall.

Colorado's historical trails

Colorado is celebrated for many reasons. Big mountains. Craft beer, World-class email newsletters. Stuff like that. But outside of libraries and museums, the Centennial State is not often celebrated for its history.

Not often enough, anyway. People have been hiking Colorado trails since long before Forest Service trailheads (or the Forest Service, for that matter – it was formed in 1905) were even conceptualized. And the remnants of those trails are still maintained for those history buffs with an adventurous streak.

The Old Spanish Trail

Meandering across the Southwest from Santa Fe to Los Angeles, the Old Spanish Trail has been called "the longest, crookedest, most arduous pack mule trail in the history of America." by historians Leroy and Ann Hafen.

First traveled in the winter of 1829, the trail was a commercial supply route for frontier settlements in California. Travelers eventually split it into three different routes, two of which cut across southwestern and central Colorado.

If you go: Though some areas along the Old Spanish Trail are open to hikers, a tour of the sites is best done as a road trip. A good overview of the trail has been compiled by the Old Spanish Trail Association, Notable sites are marked along all three routes on the Association's interactive trail map.

The Pony Express Trail
Snail mail is still around
today. But it's no longer the
primary means of communication in these United
States, and it's definitely no
longer carried across the



western states on the back of a horse.

But it was once. Men with the Pony Express once carried letters from Missouri to California in just ten days

over 2,005 miles of trail. That trail still exists, in a way, as the **Pony Express National Historic Trail**.

If you go: The trail connects historical sites across Missouri, Kansas, Nebraska, Colorado, Wyoming, Utah, Nevada, and California. Directions for auto drivers, details about historical sites, and an interactive map are available from the National Park Service.

The Santa Fe Trail First used as a trade route between the United States and Mexico, the 900-mile Santa Fe Trail (which stretches from its namesake to Franklin, Mo.), ultimately



carried the U.S. invasion of New Mexico (then a Mexican territory) in 1846.

In Colorado, the most prominent Santa Fe Trail site is undoubtedly <u>Bent's Old Fort</u> outside La Junta. The National Historic Site includes a reconstruction of the original adobe trading post, and employs historians for guided tours. Entry costs \$3 for adults and \$2 for children aged 6-12 (children under 6 get in free).

If you go: Like the Pony Express Trail, the Santa Fe National Historic Trail links historical sites across several states, and is followed by a highway. Details and an interactive map of the trail are available from the National Park Service,

Our 4 favorite Colorado waterfalls

With <u>81 official waterfalls</u>, Colorado is the 11th most waterfall-abundant state in the U.S. (Oregon tops the list with 226). So there's no shortage of waterfall hikes to choose from in the Centennial State. **Here are four of our favorites**.

Fish Creek Falls - Steamboat

This 280-foot behemoth is one of the most jaw-dropping waterfalls in Colorado, and it's just a quarter of a mile from the nearest trailhead. For hikers seeking a more of a challenge, a 2.5-mile



intermediate out-and-back trail continues to the smaller Upper Fish Creek Falls.

LEGISLATIVE NEWS cont'd

If you go: Parking at the trailhead costs \$5 per day. Dogs are welcome. After the trip, we recommend a beer and burger at Sunpie's Bistro in Steamboat.

Getting there: From Lincoln Avenue in Steamboat Springs, go north on 3^{rd} Street and then take a right on

Fish Creek Falls Road. It's four miles to the trailhead parking lot.

Judd Falls-Crested Butte This easy out-and-back trail is about half a mile to



the falls, and another five miles to Copper Lake (a beautiful turquoise lake with mountain views). When you get to the falls, walk down to the right and take a seat on the engraved bench to enjoy the sights and sounds of the waterfall.

If you go: There is no entrance or parking fee, but be sure to fill out a permit if you take the trail to Copper Lake: it helps the rangers keep track of how many people are using the trail. Getting there: From Crested Butte, take Highway 135 north until it becomes Gothic Rd. Follow the road past the ghost town of Gothic and follow the signs for Judd Falls; it's about 0.3 miles from Gothic to the trailhead.

St. Mary's Falls—Colorado Springs
With many smaller waterfalls along the way, this intermediate out-and-back trail offers plenty of opportunities to get your



feet wet and enjoy the lush green summer foliage. A **1.6-mile trek** takes you to the main waterfall, featuring a breathtaking view of water cascading 250 feet down a solid granite wall.

If you go: There are no entrance or parking fees for St. Mary's Falls, and dogs are allowed. After your hike, check out the Ivywild School in south Colorado Springs. Getting there: From Colorado Springs, take W. Cheyenne Mountain Boulevard to Old Stage Road, which turns into Gold Camp Road. Follow Gold Camp Road past Helen Hunt Falls until it dead ends at a locked gate: the trailhead is 1.2 miles past the gate, to the left of an abandoned tunnel blocked off by a fence.

Bridal Veil Falls – Glenwood Springs

Suspended on the edge of a limestone cliff, the 1.5-acre Hanging Lake, fed by Bridal Veil Falls, is a hidden oasis of crystal-clear water and lush hanging gardens. This intermediate out-and-back trail is 1.2 miles one way, but it's a steep, rocky climb to reach the falls. Most of the

trail is shaded and runs parallel to Dead Horse Creek.

If you go: Arrive before 10 a.m. or after 4 p.m. to avoid the crowd. There are no parking or entrance



fees. Swimming, fishing, and dogs are not allowed. Wash the adventure down with a beer at the <u>Glenwood Canyon</u> Brewing Company.

Getting there: Go 22 miles west of Eagle on I-70, to the Grizzly Creek exit in Glenwood Canyon. After exiting, get back on the highway going eastbound to the Hanging Lake exit. The trail is 1/4-mile east of the rest area on the left just before the bridge.

Explore Brown's Canyon

We get excited about public lands. And in Colorado, the biggest public lands story right now is that of Brown's Canyon, which is well on its way to becoming the state's next national monument and wilderness area.

The southern Colorado canyon has long been considered one of the state's best rafting and kayaking destinations, but the proposed 22,000-acre monument also provides plenty of op-



tions for hikers, backpackers and car campers.

The August campout for the Star Gazers found


14 RVs at Cheyenne Mountain State Park. It was a beautiful summer weekend, with a gorgeous super moon shining down on the camparound at night. Fating wa



GYPSIES' GRAND CANYON NATIONAL PARK TRIP - 2014

The 'travel agents' in the Gypsies chapter put together the 2014 travelong and did a bang up job of it. Jim & Linda Cooper and Terry & Jan Teetor, thank you once again for a job well done!! Six Gypsies members left the Wal Mart parking lot September 5th on their annual excursion. This trip to Grand Canyon via US hiway 160. Walsenburg was our first stop for lunch. Two units elected to forego the 2 mountain passes and travel through Albuquerque and Flagstaff. La Veta Pass was the lesser of the 2 challenges. Wolf Creek Pass at about 10,000 feet was a bit more challenging for the gas burning unit. It reminded us of the country song by C W Mc Call about 40 years ago – 'Wolf Creek Pass', an 18-wheeler loaded with crates of chickens and how it lost its brakes going down with feathers flying everywhere thru Pagosa Springs on the other side. Those who remembered had a good laugh.

Our campground at Pagosa Springs was wonderful. Saturday, we left the beautiful Rocky Mountains with the lush valleys behind and went into the desert in AZ, also beautiful. We could see the south edge of Monument Valley, the buttes and mesas. Some of us could picture the spotted ponies on the buttes, just like we saw in the old western movies. After another picnic lunch and re-fueling, we arrived at Trailer Village in the Grand Canyon National Park about 5 PM. The first thing we noticed was the abundance of elk and a few deer.

We had decided that we'd each go our own way, doing our choice of activity. One thing we learned on the 'Pink Jeep' ride was that there is a village within the National Park. Since its open 365 days a year, all services must be available; therefore, there must be adequate housing for the employees. There are dormitories for the foreign students who come in to work in various services. While we were there, China and Romania were represented. When their visas are up, people from other countries come in for a specific time. There is individual housing for the permanent employees, a K-12 school and a clinic that is capable of treating everything from a minor cold to a not-too-complicated broken bone. A major break or health issue is taken by family car, ambulance or flown out.

When we'd share our daily adventures, others would get ideas for their next day. Our 'wagon master Coopers' and the 'tail gunner, Terry' with Joyce were the adventurous souls who rode mules along the canyon rim. They had a great time, even though Terry's mule tried to

'brush' him off by crowding trees. Terry outsmarted him and stayed aboard. Joyce was coached by the trail master to use the 'crop' on her stubborn mule. He assured them that they'd never lost a mule yet!! Very comforting to know!

Another 'in park' activity was riding the bus. The bus lines are divided up in 3 sections, each serving a different area. The farthest ride took us into a 'busses only' section. One can get off at about 8 different stops, look around, and then hop on the next bus. They run every 15 minutes. One line runs to the hotels, all of which are very old and extremely expensive, even with the winter rate. The 2 campgrounds (1 dry camping, 1 with full hookups) are also served by bus every 15 minutes.



Activities not park related are in a little town about 5 miles south of the park. The pink jeeps ride is in the National Geographic Park

building, along with the IMAX and a gift shop. The film is fantastic, beginning with the 'hunters and gatherers' (Native Americans), through some of the Spanish exploration, then includes John Wesley Powell's mapping of the Grand Canyon. Very informative.

A herd of elk visited us often, with a 12-point buck drinking out of a dog's water dish! They would have caused quite a stir if they'd shown up the night we were eating our 'Southwestern Dinner' out of tin plates. Or our 'Bakin' with Bacon' dinner.

All too soon, it was Wednesday and time to leave. We followed the same routes (almost) on the return as we did going, staying in the same campground in Pagosa Springs. The US 160 group travelled a short way into Utah, looking for a place to have lunch. We turned it into 'an adventure'. If we hadn't gone that way, we'd never have known there are working oil wells on the Navajo Reservation in southeast Utah or on the Ute Mountain Reservation in southwest CO. We ate lunch at a pull-off where our road joined with US 160.

Most of us once again met at Walsenburg for our 'goodbyes and see ya's'. We're sorry that Steve & Lori Suzuki couldn't travel with us but we thought of them so often. They've been a big addition to our past trips. We wish you the best, Lori & Steve.

CHICKEN CIDER STEW

2 C. apple Cider 3 T. catsup 2 slices bacon, cut up 1½ tsp. salt

½ tsp. savory, crushed½ tsp. basil, crushed

1/4 tsp. pepper

1 (2 to 2½-lb.) broiler-fryer

4 carrots, thinly sliced 2 med. sweet potatoes, sliced

1 or 2 chopped onions

1 stalk celery, sliced

1 apple, peeled, sliced 2 T. flour

In a crockpot, put in vegetables and apples. Add chicken. Combine first 7 ingredients and pour over chicken.

Cook on high for 3-4 hours or cook on low 6-8 hours. Turn to high and add flour mixed with ½ cup cider. Cook about 15 minutes to thicken juice.

Starting immediately the National office will send all Cadet materials directly directly to the new member.

So keep using the Cadet program. Give your prospects the free 6 month trial. All they have to do is fill out the registration form and send that to Loana. She will forwaed to the national office. Be sure that you put your name on the registration as their mentor.




