



CAREER DAYS FOR THE PIKES PEAK RAINBOWS

Pikes Peak Rainbows Assist Southern Colorado Construction Days in Colorado Springs





Over a dozen Pikes Peak Rainbows assisted the National Association of Women in Construction and the El Paso County Contractors Association with their effort to promote the construction trades to over 500 high school students. This was the eighth year the Rainbows have played an important roll preparing and helping with this event at the Tab Construction site owned by FCRV members Bud and Cyndi Wheatly in Colorado Springs. The Rainbows spent over 7 hours on Wednesday, September 17th assembling the webbing for hard hats, filling backpacks with water bottles, tee shirts, and many other items while others organized the parking lot across the street in a field to accommodate over 175 cars and 25 buses.

On Thursday, September 18th the Rainbows started parking cars and pickups at 6am and continued for





over three hours. At 6:30am other Rainbows checked in hundreds of Group Leaders and volunteers. By 8am the Rainbows were then parking school buses while other Rainbows were assisting with checking in of hundreds of high school students. By starting time 507 high school students were at 50 demonstration sites. These students were challenged, fascinated, and excited by all the activities. All 507 kids received hard hats, tee shirts and the backpacks with safety glasses and other goodies assembled the previous day.

Have you ever operated a backhoe? One of the demonstrations provided over a dozen backhoes and allowed each one of the participants the opportunity to operate the machine. Some of the other demonstrations of construction activities allowed the kids to wire electrical circuits, build toolboxes, mold and cut plastic sewer pipe, lay tile, finish cement, view computer designs and many more activities.

During the day the Rainbows helped provide security, distributed over 200 pizzas and sodas to each of the 50 groups, recollected the 50 soda buckets and trash, and provide assistance where and when needed. It was an exhausting but rewarding two days for all the Rainbows who participated. The activity has grown so popular that it will be moved from Tab Construction to a larger location next year.

The group discussed items to be considered while traveling, in your RV, at a campground or dispersed camping: notice mile markers, what is around you at all times, setting a meeting place during an emergency, a second escape route out of your vehicle, fire extinguisher on hand, plenty of water to douse campfires and make sure they are not smoking when you're done. Nothing is as important as your family or your life: leave material items behind if necessary and protect your life and family during a fire, tornado or flood. Use GPS or 911 coordinates on cellphone, best to give exact location if possible.

We also held a huge Rummage Sale in June, hosted by Bill and Ann Adaska. We had great success and at the end took many bags to the Good Will. We did, of course, share a meal and Bill was a fantastic grillmaster!


TIMBERLINERS CHAPTER

We are still in a holding pattern regarding the new Legislature and as a result, I have no new news for you at this time. However, I have dropped a couple of ideas (below) for you to consider over the holidays to get you outdoors and check out the beautiful Colorado views. We want to wish you all a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

Climb Pikes Peak the local way Pikes Peak is popular. Really popular. More than half a million people visit the 14,114-foot summit of America's Mountain every year using the toll road and cog railway alone, and thousands of more reach the summit by foot. In total, the number is greater than the entire population of neighboring Colorado Springs.

All that to say that Pikes Peak, despite its virtues, can be a bit of a zoo (but what else would you expect from a mountain with a donut shop on top?). So if you're keen to experience its purple mountain majesty, you might be better off viewing the summit from afar - from the uncrowded fourmile Crags Trail.

Ski Loveland for \$33 a day

Here's what you need to know: Loveland Ski Area is selling packs of four transferrable lift tickets for \$129. That's \$33 per day of skiing, and you can share them with your friends, family, coworkers, enemies, frenemies... whoever. Or you can keep them all to vourself, of course.

It's a great deal. And it's only available through Nov. 23. So if you're into deep, steep skiing, easy access, and low prices, check it out.

Get your 4-Pak

Located on the west side of the peak, the out-and-back hike is remote but novice-friendly. With the exception of a short climb to the "Crags" themselves, the hike is almost completely flat. It climbs just 720 feet over two miles. Ambitious hikers often carry on to the Pikes Peak summit – a gentle 13.6-mile round trip.

If you go: The Crags trail is open year-round, though it does get snowy in the winter. To continue to the summit, take the right fork at Four Mile Creek to gain Pike's Playground Trail. The summit hike takes all day, but the trip to the Crags and back can be done by more hikers in 90 minutes. Leashed dogs are allowed.

Getting there: From Divide, turn south on Highway 67 and go south for about 4 miles to Crags Campground on Forest Road 383. Follow this dirt road for about 3 miles to either the lower or the upper parking lots - the lower parking lot will include a climb at the beginning, the upper parking lot grants direct access to the creek and is easier. You will see a sign as well as restroom facilities near the trailhead.

Hike RMNP's Hague Valley

More than three million people visit Rocky Mountain National Park every year. And the park's heaviest visitation days are right around... now. So if you want to enjoy the best of Estes this weekend, we suggest you avoid the usual spots.

Our weekend pick is the 15-mile out-and-back Hague Valley Trail, which tours the alpine valley of the same name. Chances are good that you'll have the 450-acre valley more or less to yourself – save a few birds, marmots and elk.

The valley stretches below the 13,560-foot Hagues Peak, and is populated by pine forests, alpine lakes, and the occasional patch of snow. The summit of the peak (the tallest in Larimer County) can be reached by a second-class scramble.

If you go: Few people hike here for a reason – the trail is tough. The full 15-mile hike includes 5,200 feet of elevation gain, and the trail is rough and hard to follow in some places. Dogs and mountain bikes are not allowed in the park.

Getting there: From Estes Park, take Fall River Road into Rocky Mountain National Park. After entering the Park, go 2 miles and turn right onto Old Fall River Road. This is a one-way dirt road, passable by any vehicle. Travel an additional 7.8 miles to the Chapin Pass Trailhead. Entry to the park costs \$20 per vehicle.




