## NATIONAL AWARDS: Humanitarian award: Wanda Parkhouse of the Gray Wolves/Ute Bobcats won the Humanitarian award.

Wanda Parkhouse was on the national team with Red Cross Disaster Health Service for thirteen years. She traveled all over the United States as a volunteer responding to the health needs of people affected by forest fires, tornadoes, hurricanes, floods, and to victims affected by the 9/11 terrorist attack. All kinds of injuries needing medical care, some due to the disaster, the rest due to the cleanup. Exacerbations of current medical problems flare up, everything from blood pressures clear out of sight, respiratory problems, heart problems, even babies come a little sooner than expected. It took all of Wanda's people skills and all of her nursing experience to help people get their lives back together after a disaster, whether it was clear across the country somewhere or right here in Colorado.

Wanda was also the Colorado State Nursing Supervisor for Red Cross for three years. She provided leadership and guidance to Red Cross Volunteers all over Colorado. She also traveled all over the state recruiting nurses and teaching them what to do in case there was a disaster in their area. She gave classes on emergency preparedness to various agencies in Colorado Springs, around the state, and while on disaster in other parts of the country. In fact, after one of the wildfires that devastated Colorado, a lady thanked Wanda for the presentation she had given the year before at a large state conference on the Three Day Emergency Backpack. The lady said she only had a few minutes to leave her house, so she was able to just grab that backpack and head out the door. It was a scary and smoky drive to safety, but the survival things in her backpack were key to her emotional well-being. All that smoke aggravated her asthma, but with prompt treatment the lady was fine.

## **Star Chasers**

Their outstanding efforts of giving back to their community and their generous donations to several charitable organizations, and coordinating the bolo horseshoes again this year at Spring Fling. They also did the registration and parking again this year at Statewide.

Every year, several of the members will donate several hours to working the booth at both Denver RV shows. They have always supported the state by attending every Spring Fling and Statewide, plus their interest displayed in all the activities of Colorado FCRV

The Star Chasers Chapter is active in performing community work on behalf of FCRV. Here are some of the things the Chapter has done in 2014:

At our monthly campout in April, they went to Fort Collins KOA in Fort Collins, CO. While there, they collected \$2 a person to play their miniature golf and donated a total of \$60 to the KOA Cancer Camp. They made sure that the campground knew who we were and what organization we were part of so that FCRV could receive recognition.

Just before Halloween in October, all the members of the Chapter decorated Halloween Treat bags and filled them with stuffed animals and activity toys for the children hospitalized at Children's Hospital in Aurora, CO. All together we donated 181 bags in 2014, which was the most bags they have ever donated. The cost per bag is estimated at about \$20 equating to over \$3,600. The Chapter has been doing this community project for years now and the hospital has become dependent on us to come through for the kids during this time of year. As the Thanksgiving holiday approaches, they start thinking about our Food Drive for the Salvation Army Food Bank in Centennial, CO. At their November meeting, they collected can goods and other non-perishable food items from their members. This year they donated 627 lbs. of food. They also split the 50/50 fund which they collect all year. A total of \$395 was also given to the Salvation Army so they could purchase food more specific to the needs of the community. Also the Chapter donated \$200 to the Denver Rescue Mission. They represent themselves as part of FCRV when they make these donations to promote the organization.

Lastly, they collected a total of 550 pounds of gently used clothes which was donated to the Jefferson County Action Center. Hopefully the donation of clothes helps those who are struggling financially not to have the added stress of trying to come up with money for clothes.

Star Chasers does their best to support Colorado FCRV by helping at Spring Fling and the Statewide Campouts. They hosted the Bolo Horseshoes game at Spring Fling in May. They also volunteered to work Registration at the State Wide Campout in the Fall. They come in on Thursday night to set up and then worked Friday through Saturday. Everyone from their Chapter who came participated in working the Registration booth. Two additional couples came up for the day on Sunday to help with our Hospitality to celebrate their 25th Anniversary. Dan and Judy Kimzey of their Chapter are the State Photographers and they spend many hours taking pictures at State and National events. We also help to support Colorado FCRV First Aid and Teen Queen Programs by participating in their fund raising efforts.
