Remembering Bill Eckman





ON TO HAPPIER THINGS

Denver's best spring trails

Even after last weekend's snow, we feel pretty sure that spring is finally here. And honestly, our bodies aren't quite ready for trail season.

So this week, we rounded up three urban "trails" that we use as training grounds for this summer's mountain adventures.

Cherry Creek Trail

The multi-use Cherry Creek Trail begins in Denver at Confluence Park and travels more than 40 miles along Cherry Creek to Castlewood Canyon State Park. Our favorite section is the 7.7-mile stretch between the Cherry Creek Shopping Center and Village Greens Park. That section ends right by True Food Kitchen, which features organic craft beverages and a full menu of healthy appetizers and entrees. If you go: Parking is free at the Cherry Creek Shopping Center. Other access points with free parking include Pulaski, Creekside, Cook and John F. Kennedy and Village Greens parks. After 8 miles of meandering trails, the scenic Mary Carter Greenway turns into the South Platte River Trail,

which continues another 17.8 miles through downtown Denver to the trailhead in Thornton.

One of our favorite stops along the Greenway is Nixon's Coffee House. This little coffee shop and smoothie bar has a large outdoor patio facing the river and caters to cyclists with bike racks and a bike repair station. If you go: There is a 15 mph speed limit along the trail. The Mary Carter Greenway begins at Chatfield State Park (a fee site), but free parking can be accessed at the Chatfield dam and reservoir. Other access points with free parking include Reynold's Landing and Centennial parks.





Clear Creek Trail

The Clear Creek Trail starts at 6th Avenue and follows the creek through Golden's residential areas and historic downtown. At Ford Street, the trail takes a detour around the Molson Coors beer processing plant and follows the frontage road along the Golden Highway (US 58) before returning creekside at Interstate 70. After 6.5 miles, we usually turn around in Wheat Ridge and retrace our path. That brings us back to Golden's historic downtown district, where we can refuel at at Goozell Yogurt & Coffee. If you go: There are several access points to the Clear Creek Trail in town with the heaviest use between Lions and Vanover parks. Parking is free in downtown Golden.

So here are some ideas to help you get into shape for those hammocks at the camp ground.

That is the latest info from this spot. Hope to see you at Fall Statewide or somewhere down the road.


Silver Foxes


for camping, right? WRONG!!! – Mother Nature had the temerity to decide otherwise. We were forced to cancel our first campout of the year. It was disaster-prone




Homeward bound!


to make it. They played some games, watched the model airplanes and went on a tour of the

Rules for all Contestants Colorado FCRV Teen King / Colorado FCRV Teen Queen

Parents or legal guardians of contestants must be current members of FCRV and in good standing, or the Teen must be a member of FCRV in good standing.

Age limit is 13 to 19 inclusive. The Contestant must be 13 to 19 years old on the day of the contest at the Fall Statewide event prior to the following year's National CampVention. The Contestant must also be 13 to 19 years old on the day of the contest at the National CampVention.

The contestant must be single and at no time have been married. The contestant's moral character should exemplify the goals of FCRV by exhibiting wholesome and respected qualities associated with family oriented values.

Contestants must complete official registration form and return it to the State Teen Directors by the date specified on the registration form.




