Hard Hat Lunch



Plans are underway for another excellent meal and camaraderie in Lima. The day, time, and location will be announced shortly. We have engaged an amazing speaker who will enlighten us on the history of the railroads in Lima. You won't want to miss this!

Scott Trostel from Fletcher, Ohio, is a writer and speaker concentrating on transportation and industrial history. His topic will be: THE AGE OF THE RAILROAD AT LIMA, taking the audience through Lima's development from a tiny village on the edge of Ohio's Great Black Swamp to a regional and national hub as a railroad center. Seven railroads once operated into Lima, with two lines establishing major shops in town. Over 7,500 locomotives were constructed by four builders. Railroad freight and passenger cars were built at five sites. The modern day tank car was invented and first constructed here. The city boasted an early street car line and was the first town to successfully operate an electrified street car system. Electric interurban railways operated five lines into Lima, with one establishing a major shop to build and maintain interurban cars. At its peak almost 60% of employment was with the railroads and allied industries. Lima truly set its watch by the locomotive whistle. This is an amazing story of the rise and fall of the railroad industry at Lima, Ohio.

Scott has completed 52 titles and five documentary DVDs. He appeared on the award winning documentary, MADE IN AMERICA LIMA LOCOMOTIVE WORKS. Included in his genre are a number of railroad transportation histories, industrial histories and the acclaimed book, THE LINCOLN FUNERAL TRAIN. He appeared on the 2009 History Channel documentary; STEALING LINCOLN'S BODY. Scott has consulted to The Library of Congress. He is also a historical consultant to national news networks. He has been associated with the Allen County Historical Society for 50 years in the focus of Lima and Allen County railroad history.





Campventions Held in Ohio – Part 2

Nineteen years after the 1964 Campvention, Campvention 1983 was held in Ohio, specifically at Buck Creek State Park, Springfield in the southwestern part of the state. Dick & Pat Smith, Ohio State Directors at the time, were the Campvention chairs. 4031families attended. The area of the park designated for our use was basically abandoned farm area and was overgrown with weeds. Jim & I were Field Directors at the time. During a Spring Seminar held in Springfield, the Smiths took all of us over to the state park, specifically to our designated grounds. They said, "Ohio is going to host the 1983 Campven-



Dick & Pat Smith nearly as tall as we were! I believe all of us thought, "We're going to what?"

Dick & Pat Smith shared: "We have so many wonderful memories that we don't know where to start. Our fondest memory is that of about five hundred Ohio members, working on weekends for nearly three years, turning an area of weeds, some of them five feet high, into a campground for four thousand and 31camp-

ers. The most important thing is after all that work and all the challenges we had to cope with, we all remained friends. Several months after the Campvention we got a phone call from the ODNR telling us they were going to make the area into a permanent campground and would we please call off our people; they were being swamped by all the letters being sent by our members."

Yes, there was a letter-writing campaign to the Ohio Department of Natural Resources to establish a permanent campground. And, the campaign worked! On July 24, 1987 the campground at Buck Creek State Park was dedicated. Smiths as the Campvention chairs and we as Ohio State Directors were invited to attend. Pat Smith cut the ribbon, making it official.

Also from Smiths to wrap up 1983: "Another incident that sticks in my mind happened after the close of Campvention. Friday evening after the close of Campvention on Thursday we along with our parade chair people, Hugh and Helen Groseclose, took our contact lady from the Springfield Chamber of Commerce out to dinner as a' thank you' for all of her help in setting up the parade among other things. We had 103 entries in the parade so you can imagine the effort she put forth. Shortly after dinner we expressed our sincere gratitude and said our 'Goodbyes' and headed back to camp where we walked into a surprise party for our 25th wedding anniversary with music, a wedding cake and about 200 guests. The dinner was a ruse by Hugh to get us away so they could set up the party. Grosecloses knew it was our anniversary. He had called us at home a month before Campvention and suggested we take Diane Smith out to dinner. Linda Hen-

nie baked the four-tier wedding cake. We'll never forget that evening." As an attendee at the party, they were surprised!

And, lastly, Campvention 1991 was held at the Canfield Fairgrounds in Canfield. The Canfield Fair is Ohio's largest county fair, held on 353 acres. Jim & I, as Ohio State Directors, were the chairs. We did not volunteer outright to chair the campvention. While attending the Executive Board meeting at the 1989 Campvention in Oklahoma, it was announced that no one had come forth to host 1991. Ed Crook, West Virginia State Director, came to us and said that he thought he might have a site if Ohio would help. West Virginia did not have enough members to host on their own. We agreed to help. A couple of weeks later, Ed

called. The place he had in mind would not be available. (Campvention was locked into a set formula at that time.) Our phone was in our kitchen. I remember standing in our kitchen, and Jim saying that it was a 'no go' in West Virginia. What do we do?

We had a 'less than two-year timeframe'. We couldn't do what was done in 1983. We were pure novices at this. In 1983 we were Religious Services Chairs & Band Liaisons. Our first thought was to call the Ohio Tourism Bureau. Jim called. They couldn't help us, but they suggested the state agricultural department. Jim called and was given the names of two fairgrounds that might work for us; both were on the eastern side of the state. We lived on the western side of the state and were not familiar with either. Jim called Lawrence Ford, our district director for the southeast. He said that we didn't want the one in their area. It was on a reclaimed strip mine. He said there wasn't enough flat area for campers. That left Canfield. Jim called.

There wasn't a Campvention Director back then. There was a Campvention Coordinator. Problem #1: we were between co-

ordinators. The old one had resigned and wasn't helpful. The new one had not been appointed yet. Problem #2: no campvention guidelines. We were told not to use the old ones. New ones? Well, they didn't have

those finished yet so we couldn't use those. Problem #3: We were told there wasn't any money available for the usual Campvention advance. We asked our Ohio members to register early so there were operating funds. They did!! Somehow, a contract was made with the fairgrounds and 2415 families attended.

Hazel Laughner, PA, shared a memory: "Clarence and I were hosts for PA's hospitality. We had chicken salad sandwiches. I thought, oh my, I need a cooler to

keep them. Pat and Bob James were the hospitality chairpersons. I

gave them a call and asked if it would be possible to get a cooler. They called and said that they had one with shelves – perfect. What a gem they were to work with. Also, a couple years later we were camping in FL and happened to be in the same campground that they were and met up with Pat and Bob. They asked if we'd like to go to church. We said we do but didn't know where there was a church. So they took us to their church and then we went out to eat. What a fun day that was. I remember them so well."


There were some unique hurdles to overcome in Canfield that were not shared with us till closer to Campvention. The fairgrounds people and the town police said we would need to get our campers onto the grounds as they couldn't have them backed up on the street. Jim asked the parking chairs Russ & Jane Reno and the registration chairs to devise a plan to accomplish that. They did. And, we publicized to the membership the

times they'd encounter the least amount of traffic. And, we advised them to stop at a mall, cool off, and rest before arriving on grounds. The plan worked wonderfully well. No backups!

Another hurdle was the noise issue. No noise parades! The police were adamant about that. Jim reinforced that from the stage almost nightly. The Thundering Herd Chapter from New York solved that....the noiseless parade! Their noiseless parade through the Executive Board meeting was so much fun! Thank you, Thundering Herd!





The fair rep presented us with a buckeye tree from the Canfield Fairgrounds grounds. It survives in the front yard in Tipp City - probably 30' tall, at least.

Canada Organizations Promote RV, Camping Week

Three Canadian organizations associated with camping and the RV industry are coordinating the 2nd Annual Canada RV and Camping Week that will begin May 23 following the country's Victoria Day long holiday.



The Recreation Vehicle Dealers Association (RVDA) of Canada, the Canadian Camping and RV Council (CCRVC) and Go RVing Canada are looking to increase campground attendance and drive more customers into Canadian RV dealerships.

With a goal of raising \$20,000, campgrounds and RV dealerships additionally are raising money by selling \$2 paper "stars" through Make A Wish Canada to fulfill the dream of a 6-year-old cancer victim who wants to go camping with his parents.

"We are hoping to have 50 or 60 dealers across the country to participate," said Eleonore Hamm, president of RVDA of Canada.

Whichever dealership raises the most money will be given free convention registration for the RV Dealers International Convention/Expo Nov. 6-10 at Ballys in Las Vegas.

Along with promoting RVing and camping generally, a countrywide marshmallow roast is planned for May 27. "We are encouraging all of our dealers to participate," said Hamm, noting that 2017 is the 150th anniversary of Canada's founding. "There are a lot of celebrations happening and Canada Camping and RV Week is a way for RVers to experience our land in terms of seeing the great outdoors."

"We are targeting 100 campgrounds to participate, some of which will be offering discounts during the

week," added Shane Devenish, executive director of CCRVC, a group of private campgrounds. "The idea is to fill up camping sites after the long weekend and bring potential RVers into RV dealerships."

Meanwhile, in conjunction with Canada RV and Camping Week, the 6-year-old who has lymphoma and whose name is being withheld, will go camping in a Rockwood camping trailer provided to Go RVing Canada at a discount by Forest River Inc. The



boy won't know that his wish is being granted until the day before the conclusion of Canadian RV and

Camping Week onMay 27.

"We are just finalizing which Ontario campground they will be visiting," said Chris Mahoney, Go RVing Canada executive director.

Seniors Can Get Lifetime Access to National Parks For Just \$10. But Not For Long

Older Americans can access more than 84 million acres of land protected by the National Park Service for the rest of their lives for just \$10 — but not for long.

The National Park Service's lifetime pass will be eight times more expensive soon — costing \$80 for American citizens who are older than 62. And while it is unclear when the price surge will take effect, this week — National Park Week — offers a good opportunity to remind older Americans to purchase their passes before it's too late.

To get your Senior pass through the mail, just submit a completed application, proof of residency and age, and \$20. The fee covers the cost of the pass and a document processing fee.

Ingrassia: Outdoor Rec Stepping Forward in D.C.

The following column by Recreation Vehicle Association (RVDA) President Phil Ingrassia, appearing in the April issue of *RV Executive Today*, reports on the progress made for key industry issues through the recently-formed Outdoor Recreation Industry Roundtable.

As great as business has been for the RV industry over the past few years, there are outside factors that do impact our business. That's why one of RVDA's key organizational values is advocating on public policy issues that affect RV dealers, and it's why we're excited about the formation of the Outdoor Recreation Industry Roundtable (ORIR) with RVIA, NMMA, and many others.

Putting the business of outdoor recreation front and center is important in today's political environment. In an era of shrinking federal budgets, many departments that manage public lands vital to outdoor recreation are rewarded for closing campgrounds, reducing hours of operation, and limiting access. This goes on despite the fact that recreation is the leading revenue driver for many national parks and forests.

Dealers across the country are well aware of the need to modernize campgrounds on federal lands and improve roads and bridges in national parks and forests. Allowing public-private partnerships to bring campgrounds up to today's standards will alleviate some of the budget problems on federal lands, help revive the economy in many rural "gateway" communities, and provide more opportunities for owners of the hundreds of thousands of new RVs that are sold each year.

Earlier this year, I was talking to California dealers at the CalRVDA annual meeting – folks who are

at ground zero of attempts to limit access. Closing off areas used by off-highway vehicles (OHVs) limits their use and affects dealers who sell toy haulers. ORIR has made it clear that it's important to protect our national public lands, but it's also important to balance protection with common sense and responsible use.

Last month, ORIR briefed Congressional representatives on some of its priorities, including:

• Prioritizing recreation-related infrastructure improvements in federal agency budgets.

• Establishing more public-private partnerships to address maintenance backlogs on public lands.

• Achieving better balance between recreation and conservation in federal agency decisions.

• Developing and deploying a digital information strategy for outdoor recreation on federal lands.

The groups coming together through ORIR represent diverse outdoor recreation interests and have found common ground in many areas when it comes to trying to change the mindset of those charged with managing our public lands.

"As an outcome of cuts in federal spending, many federal agencies are reducing or eliminating recreational opportunities," says ORIR member and Archery Trade Association President Jay McAninch. "The ORIR member industries believe this is tragic, and are offering private investments on public lands as a way to provide all Americans with the chance to recreate outdoors – an American birthright. Our industry's view is this is a much-needed stimulus for the federal lands, which are sorely lacking in welcoming our citizens outdoors."



Grilled Guacamole

MAKES 2 CUPS (450 G) 3 small avocados, halved, pitted, and peeled

1/2 small red onion, root end left intact 1 medium tomato, finely chopped

Handful of cilantro leaves, chopped

1/2 jalapeño pepper, minced

2 cloves garlic, minced

1/4 teaspoon kosher salt, plus 1/4 teaspoon kosher salt, plus more to taste Juice of 1 medium lime

Prepare a grill over medium-high heat. Place the avocados and onion cut sides down on the grill. Cook for about 10 minutes, until lightly charred with grill marks, turning once. Transfer to a cutting board. Cut the onion into small dice and cut the avocados into large chunks.

In a medium bowl, mash the avocado with a fork. Stir in the onion, tomato, cilantro, jalapeño, garlic, salt, and lime juice. Taste and add more salt as needed. Serve warm.
