

Camping Recipe Corner from Chef Mike Anderson

Grilled Corn Salad with Chili Lime Mayo



Ingredients

Chile-lime mayo

- 1/2 cup mayo or plain Greek style yogurt
- Juice of one lime
- 1/2 tsp mild chile powder (plus a little more for dusting)
- 1/4 tsp smoked paprika
- 1 tsp hot sauce

Mix together all ingredients and refrigerate until ready to add the corn. Can be done well in advance.

- 6 ears corn in husks
- 1/2 cup coarsely chopped cilantro (optional)
- 3 scallions, sliced
- 1/2 cup Cotija cheese, crumbled

Method

Using a big pot or pail, soak the corn *in husks* in cold water for at least 1 hour. Use a smaller lid or plate as a weight to keep the cobs submerged.

Arrange husks around the outer edges of grill (low heat). The steam from the soaking period will cook the corn. As the husks toast, about 5 minutes on the first side, use tongs to rotate each cob in quarter turns (so the cobs cook evenly). When the husks are toasted all around (about 20 or 25 minutes), remove. When cool enough to handle, shuck.

Lightly char the shucked corn on all sides over medium fire for about 10 minutes. Do this dry: no oil or salt or pepper.

To cut the kernels from the cob: Stand each cob in the center of a large roasting pan (to catch the falling kernels). Slice down the ear with a knife and work your way around, cutting off the kernels as close to the cob as you can without digging into the cob. Add the kernels to the spicy mayo along with the cilantro and scallions, mixing well to coat. Mix in most of the cheese and scatter the rest over the top, along with a dusting of chile powder.

5 (1 ounce) squares chopped white chocolate20 oatmeal cookies1 (1.55 ounce) bar milk chocolate candy1 cup miniature marshmallows



Step 1: Melt white chocolate in a double boiler or microwave slowly, spread evenly over the bottoms of the cookies. Break up the milk chocolate bar into 10 pieces, and place 1 piece onto the white chocolate side of 10 cookies. Place the marshmallows on top of the milk chocolate. Top with the remaining cookies, creating a chocolate-marshmallow sandwich.

Step 2: Toast cookies over a campfire, or stove using tongs until the chocolate and marshmallow has melted, about 3 minutes.



Take exit 269 B and head west on Colorado Highway 14 into Fort Collins. Follow the signs to U.S. Highway 287 north (about ten minutes). Take 287 north until you get to the northern edge of Fort Collins (about ten more minutes). Shortly thereafter, 287 will split off to the right to go to Laramie. Do not follow 287 at this point. Rather, continue straight into the town of Laporte. The second stoplight after this split will be Taft Hill Road (CR 19). Turn left onto Taft Hill Road (CR 19). Now get into the very first left-hand turning lane that you come to, which is about 1/2 mile down Taft Hill Road (CR 19). Turn left onto Lakeside Resort Lane and follow the concrete driveway straight through the gate.
