# D.A.S.A.T

## Diabetes

In an effort to improve our health, safety and welfare, it is time to explore various areas of our DASAT program areas that are not directly related to a major disaster. Let's start off this time with the fundamentals of diabetes. This is a chronic health issue for so many of our FCRV family members. Everyone needs to be aware of this disease, and its symptom's so that if you need to help a diabetic you have the proper information to adequately assist this individual.

A simplistic explanation of this disease is as follows. Simply our bodies use the foods we eat to create energy. Our food is turned into glucose (basically sugar) and then the pancreas (an organ near the stomach) produces the hormone (glucose) and moves the sugar into the cell of our bodies. If you are an individual who has diabetes, your body doesn't make enough insulin and basically sugar builds up in your blood.

The first question that comes to mind is, can this be controlled and the response is a resounding "yes". Having this extra amount of sugar in your blood system may not sound like a big deal but diabetes is a serious disease and can cause various health complications, which include the following: heart disease, blindness, kidney failure, and lower-extremity issues.

Like many other health related diseases it is important to know your family history. All health factors, May or not have any effect on you, but the more you know about the health issue of your family the

better prepared you may be. If you have a family member who has diabetes the likely hood that you may have this disease increases. Your ethnic background, is another factor for a greater risk especially for African American, Latino/Hispanic American, Native American or Pacific Islander. The older you are the greater the risk factor. If you have a history of gestational diabetes your risk increases. Additional factors include, obesity and being overweight. The lack of physical inactivity and high blood pressure along with abnormal cholesterol levels are all determining facts.

Moving forward, prevention measures are important as there is no cure for diabetes. Here is some suggestive ways to prevent or delay the overall onset of diabetes. They include, become physically active. It is important to have physical activity for at least 30 minutes or more 5 times a week. Increase your efforts as necessary going forward. Quit smoking (and vaping) totally. Look closely at your dietary needs-adopt healthy eating habits. Make changes and choose meals by eating non-starch veggies, (carrots, broccoli, green means, kale, cauliflower). Eat lean meats-the skinless type of chicken and turkey and lean cuts of pork and beef. Consume low-fat dairy products, drink skim milk and fat free yogurts. Whole grains-brown rice are excellent for your health. Consume healthy fats in small amounts, olive, canola, sunflowers and peanut oil.

If you think you might have diabetes first consult with your family health care provider. Some of the symptoms of diabetes include the following: frequent urination, excessive thirst, unexplained weight loss, the sudden vision changes, extreme hunger, tingling or numbness in the hand and feet, and general fatigue. If any of these apply, seek medical attention for further clarification. This may require some tests, but

the better you are informed the better prepared you have become.

The basic treatment of diabetes is the key to living a longer and healthier life style. If by change you have been diagnosed with diabetes, it is important to work very closely with your doctor, and follow closely their directions. Treatment may include, diet controls, home glucose testing, exercise, and oral medications and or insulin. It all depend on your specific medical care as prescribed.

Overall many individuals live with this disease and have developed a healthy life style. Knowing what to do and how to control what you do and what you eat makes all the difference in the world.

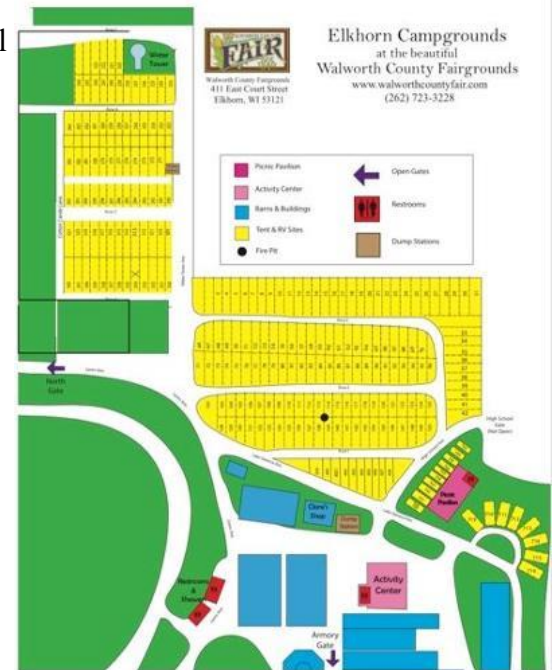


## Wander to Elkhorn, WI Campvention 2021 July 11-16, 2021

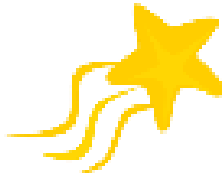
Wander to Elkhorn WI July 11 – 16, 2021.

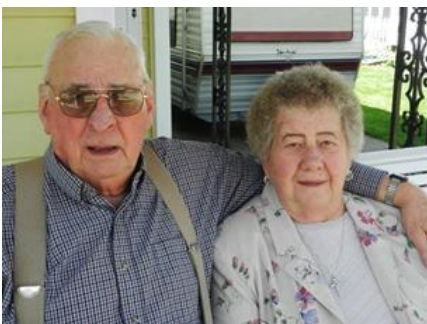
