

RECIPEEasy RV Dinner Ideas

Enter: the Instant Pot. Our Instant Pot earned its spot on our list of things you don't need in your RV but you'll be really glad you have. That's because cooking with one requires the same skill level as using a slow cooker (you literally just toss in a bunch of ingredients) but the pressure cooker function means in under an hour, you are sitting down to a hearty meal.

Our favorite way to use the Instant Pot when traveling is to plan for meals at home (and prep ingredients at home if possible). When we roll into our campground, I get the ingredients loaded and get the IP cooking while we continue to unhitch, level and set up the camper. By the time we are finished setting everything up, dinner that tastes as good as it smells is ready to eat.

Spicy Honey Instant Pot Chicken:

4 Chicken breasts cut into bite size chunks	1 Tbsp brown sugar
3 Tbsp honey	1 Tbsp minced ginger
1.5 Tbsp minced garlic	1/4 cup soy sauce
1 Tbsp Sriracha or more if you want or less	1 Tsp Worcestershire Sauce
1/2 onion diced	1 Tbsp sesame seeds—optional to top
2 green onions—optional to top	2 Tbsp cornstarch

Put chicken chunks and diced onion into the Instant Pot. Mix all other ingredients (except cornstarch) well with a fork and pour on top of chicken. Close lid and steam valve and set Instant Pot to high pressure cook for 4 minutes.

Do quick release and carefully lift lid. Put some of the hot sauce in a small bowl with the cornstarch and whisk together, then add back into the pot and stir. Set Instant Pot to sauté, normal and let bubble for a few minutes.

Allow to sit for a few minutes so the sauce thickens.

Serve over rice or quinoa and enjoy!




We had our first hike of the season on Saturday morning, and then just generally enjoyed the fellowship of friends all day long.




Then came the long awaited climax of the weekend; the first campfire of the year. Life doesn't get any better


Rolling Springs

Grateful for the chance to come once again to gather as a family. Looking forward to new adventures!





Elderly Sleep Issues

Our bodies just aren't made to last forever. They wear out and that creates all sorts of issues; sleep disorders being just one of many.

As we age, we tend to need less and less sleep. For example, senior citizens generally require 30-60 minutes less sleep than those younger than them (MedlinePlus, U.S. National Library of Medicine). In addition to the duration of the sleep, sleep intervals are also shortened. It's not unusual for an elder to wake up several times per night for no apparent reason.

There are many, many reasons that sleep may be disturbed. In addition to simple age, some of those might include:

- Depression
- Inactivity (no regular exercise)
- Associated pain (i.e., arthritis)
- Medication side effects
- Use of alcohol or caffeine

Of course, when an elder complains of lack of sleep or appears more tired than usual it prompts a caregiver to consider a physician's visit, which is to be expected. A thorough exam with a complete history may show some insights as to the reasons for the poor sleep patterns. Yet, it is also likely that no one area will be identified as the cause, thus requiring a slow methodical elimination of potential causes; such as treating any chronic pain issues or reviewing and altering medications. It is also very important that solid information be obtained from the elder during this treatment period.

There are some simple, yet effective ways to improve one's sleep:

- Don't eat too close to bedtime
- Reduce the intake of alcohol and caffeine during the day, and especially just prior to bedtime
- Avoid watching TV in bed
- Increase your exercise programs (with your doctor's permission, of course)
- Try reading prior to bed
- Make certain you stick to a routine, i.e., getting up and going to bed at the same time every day

Obtaining the proper level of sleep can be difficult. All sorts of issues can invade our minds as we try to fall asleep at night. The aging process doesn't seem to cooperate with the sleep process very well.

Follow some of the easy tips mentioned above and hopefully sleep will once again be a pleasantry that you anticipate at the end of every day.

Take exit 269 B and head west on Colorado Highway 14 into Fort Collins. Follow the signs to U.S. Highway 287 north (about ten minutes). Take 287 north until you get to the northern edge of Fort Collins (about ten more minutes). Shortly thereafter, 287 will split off to the right to go to Laramie. Do not follow 287 at this point. Rather, continue straight into the town of Laporte. The second stoplight after this split will be Taft Hill Road (CR 19). Turn left onto Taft Hill Road (CR 19). Now get into the very first left-hand turning lane that you come to, which is about 1/2 mile down Taft Hill Road (CR 19). Turn left onto Lakeside Resort Lane and follow the concrete driveway straight through the gate.

STRAWBERRY BANANA FRENCH TOAST

For those that were at Spring Fling, you had a treat with Chef Mike Anderson.

He made this and a couple more breakfast items that will be shared in later editions.

INGREDIENTS:

1 1/2 cup milk
 2 eggs, beaten
 1/8 teaspoon ground nutmeg
 1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon
 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
 3 oz. cream cheese, room temperature
 8 slices bread, Texas toast style, about 1" thick
 2 bananas, thinly sliced
 1 cup fresh strawberries, thinly sliced
 4 tablespoons butter
 Powdered sugar
 Maple syrup or strawberry compote



INSTRUCTIONS:

1. In a shallow bowl, combine milk, eggs, nutmeg, cinnamon and vanilla. Set aside.
2. To assemble, spread a thin layer of the cream cheese onto 1 side of the bread slices. Top half of the slices with the fruit, reserving some for garnish. Place another piece of bread on top, cream cheese side down, creating a sandwich.
3. Preheat skillet or griddle on low medium heat. Brush with butter.
4. Dip sandwiches into the egg mixture batter, coating all sides.
5. Place on the skillet or griddle. Cook 3 to 4 minutes per side, then turn on the edges and cook to brown evenly.
6. To serve, garnish with additional fruit and sprinkle with powdered sugar. Serve with maple syrup or strawberry compote.
7. Enjoy!
