

Bisquick Pumpkin Bread



Ingredients

- * 1/3 cup vegetable oil
- * 1 cup canned pumpkin
- * 3 eggs
- * 2 1/2 cups Bisquick
- * 1 1/4 cups sugar
- * 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- * 1/2 cup raisins

Directions:

- * Heat oven to 350 degrees
- Generously grease bottom of 9x5 loaf pan
- Stir all ingredients except raisins in pan with fork until moistened; beat vigorously 1 minute
- * Stir in raisins
- * (I also added pecans as I love pecans!)
- * Bake until toothpick inserted in center comes out clean, 45 to 55 minutes
- * Cool 5 minutes
- * Run knife or metal spatula around sides of loaf to loosen; remove from pan
- * (If load sticks to pa, press gently on sides of loaf with knife or metal spatula)






