






Woodland Wookies



Irish Potato Candies

Yield: 38 to 40 candies



INGREDIENTS:

4 oz cream cheese, at room temperature

4 tablespoons unsalted butter, softened

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

1/2 teaspoon salt

1 lb confectioners sugar - about 1 and 1/2 tightly packed cups

7 oz sweetened shredded coconut

1/4 cup ground cinnamon

Line a baking sheet with parchment paper. Set aside.

Place the cream cheese, butter, vanilla and salt together and mix on medium speed until fluffy, about 1 minute. Reduce the speed to low and slowly add the confectioners sugar until fluffy and incorporated. Add the coconut and mix on low until just incorporated, about 1 minute.

Using a tablespoon measure, spoon out level tablespoons of the candy mixture onto the prepared baking sheet. Using your hands, shape each spoonful into an oval potato shape.

Place the cinnamon in a medium bowl. Roll each potato candy in the cinnamon until fully coated and place back on the prepared baking sheet. Chill the candies in the refrigerator for 30 minutes before serving.

You can refrigerate the candies in an airtight container between layers of parchment or wax paper for up to a week.
